

The content of your app, or contentID, is a unique identifier that distinguishes your app from other apps. It is used to identify your app in the app store and to track your app's performance. You can create a content ID with either a unique identifier (UUID) or a string with a specific format. All content IDs must be unique and cannot be changed. You will need to provide your content ID when you create your app in the app store.

Requirements

1. Your app must be a valid Swift or Objective-C app.
2. Content ID must be a string.
3.
